- Reclaiming divine femininity and bodily autonomu
- ·Honoring bees, the divine feminine, and cycles of creation

Common Magical Activities

- •Anointing rituals with honeysuckle or jasmine oil
- •Honey jar spells for sweetening intentions, relationships, or outcomes
- •Ritual baths with honey, oats, milk, or rose petals
- Sacred self-pleasure as spellwork
- •Handfasting or renewal-of-vows ceremonies
- •Offerings to bees or bee spirits (honey on stones, yellow flowers)
- •Crafting mead or sipping it in moonlight
- •Decorating your altar with honeycomb shapes, gold candles, and wildflowers
- •Journaling about what you desire to invite more sweetness into your life
